

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

ACADEMIC PATHWAY







INTRODUCTION

Objectively, the certificate level will serve as an introduction to the Arabic Language, which target those with little to no Arabic learning background. This course will focus on the four basic language skills of speaking, reading, listening, and writing. Student will be able to initiate and response to simple Arabic conversation. Students can read and have a considerable understanding of any text given. In addition to this, they will be introduced to Arabic grammar and classical text.

This course is designed to transition students to the pre-diploma level. When a student completes this course with a grade of (B) or better, their application can be considered for the Arabic language pre-diploma level.

OBJECTIVE

- Moderate proficiency in the four language skills; reading, listening, writing, and conversing.
- Moderate understanding of introductory Arabic grammar.

CERTIFICATION

Students must complete and pass all **24 credit hours** by which a certificate in Arabic language will be granted.

ENTRY REQUIREMENT

- Open to students from the age of 16 onwards
- Able to recite the Qur'an moderately. An entrance test will be conducted when needed.

ASSESSMENT METHOD


Each subject will be assessed by examination (60%) and by a continuous assessment (20%) throughout the semester, by means of assignments, presentations or class tests which will be determined by the lecturer. Students will be given attendance marks (20%) including their participation.

LECTURE SCHEDULE

The curriculum is taught over 2 semesters of 32 weeks, 12 credit hours for each semester.

REPEAT POLICY

- Students who fail 3 or more subjects must repeat the whole semester.
- Students who fail less than 3 subjects will be allowed for a retake examination by which the highest attainable grade is C. Students who fail in the retake paper must remodule the subject(s) once available.
- ➤ No provision of supplementary class unless enough students register for a particular subject. Hence, students will have to wait for the next available class.

1. MUHADASAH (CONVERSATIONAL ARABIC)



MUHADASAH I (2 CREDIT HOURS)

This subject focuses mainly on the conversational side of the language. For example, how to be involved in a dialogue in terms of initiating and responding. This subject will be interactive-based, and students must be participative and responsive. Lessons and themes are carefully selected to remain relevant to students who are studying Arabic for the first time. In addition, this subject will allow students to practice conversing in day-to-day context.

MUHADASAH II (2 CREDIT HOURS)

The conversational side of the subject will move to a more challenging title but still relatively relevant. In addition, the subject will also expose students to discussion, description and public speaking in Arabic.

<u>Textbook:</u> MIC Publication will be used for Muhadasah I & II.

EXAMINATION FORMAT

MUHADASAH I & II

There is only oral examination. The exam will test on the students' proficiency to read Arabic text and converse in Arabic.

2. INSHA'

(COMPOSITION & COMPREHENSION)



INSHA' I & II (2 CREDIT HOURS EACH)

This subject ultimately consists of two major components; composition and comprehension. Ultimately, students are expected to express and compose a sound and proper Arabic writing. As for the latter, to develop the ability to understand any given text.

Complementing the book, worksheets on both comprehension and composition will be done regularly.

The composition will be limited to just dialogue writing and essay.

Textbook: (العربيه بين يديك) Volume 1.1 will be used as the main book for Insha' I and Volume 1.2 for Insha' II.

EXAMINATION FORMAT

There will be two parts to the Insha' examination. Primarily the two written examinations will focus on comprehension and essay writing. The examinations will amount to 100 marks each. In other words, altogether the marks will amount to 200 marks, in which, a percentage of 100% will be taken as the final result.

A) Paper I (50%)

This will be done outside of the examination period, during one of the 16 academic weeks.

3. KHAT





KHAT (2 CREDIT HOURS)

This subject will focus on methods of writing such as identifying the Arabic letters (huruf hijayiyah) and how to write them in four different forms: initial, medial, final and isolated. There will be continuous spelling and dictation sessions

Textbook: (مفتاح القراءة و الكتابة) Volume 1 by Dr. Imran Al-Alawiye, with additional exercises which consist of writing exercises on phrases and spelling that will be done regularly.

On top of that, the lecturer will also provide students with additional writing resources to equip them with necessary knowledge and as a support to the usage of the chosen book. Spelling and dictation activities are reserved here.

EXAMINATION FORMAT

There will be only one examination item which is the writing examination. The examination will amount to 100 marks.

QUR'AN & TAJWID I & II (2 CREDIT HOURS EACH)

The inclusion of the Our'an in this subject is to highlight to students the close correlation between the Our'an and the Arabic language. This also serves to instill in students the correct motivation and intentions in learning the Arabic language and to have an understanding of the Qur'an and to foster a relationship to the Qur'an and ultimately Allah the Almighty.

Qur'an & Tajwid I will focus solely on recitation of selected Surahs with sound Makharij and Tajwid. However, students are not required to memorise the Surahs.

Qur'an & Tajwid II will focus on reading and memorising. Students are required to memorise selected Surahs of Juz'

Students will learn how to make grammatically sound sentences, which will be helpful in writing and speaking. It is not limited to just the practical side but also in terms of understanding text especially the Qur'an. Reasons as to why a certain word or structures are used to describe a particular topic.

Students will complete the whole of Sarf syllabus before continuing to Nahu



ASSESSMENT


Assessment will be based on class participation and student attendance, written assignments, quizzes, and a presentation. No written examination.

PRE-DIPLOMA IN ARABIC LANGUAGE



ACADEMIC PATHWAY







INTRODUCTION

This programme aims to give students a clear and distinct picture of the two major branches of the Arabic language, namely Arabic linguistics and literature. The aim is to consolidate the students' knowledge of the Arabic language to better equip them for the next level of study. The main focus of this course is on the linguistics aspect of the language.

Students who enrol to this programme must have a good background in the Arabic language. It is also imperative that they are familiar with the language as lectures will largely be in Arabic. Syllabuses for this course are exclusively in Arabic language as well.

OBJECTIVE

- Good proficiency in the four language skill.
- > Good foundation of Arabic grammar and classical Arabic.
- Good foundation of introductory Islamic sciences.

CERTIFICATION

Students must complete and pass all **28 credit hours** by which a certificate in pre-diploma in Arabic language will be granted.

LECTURE SCHEDULE

The curriculum is taught over 2 semesters of 32 weeks, 14 credit hours for each semester.

ENTRY REQUIREMENT

- Direct entry for MIC certificate in Arabic holder with the **passing grade of B or CGPA 3.00** and above, full- time secondary madrasah graduate or equivalent qualification.
- ➤ GCE O-Level graduate, certification from a renowned local or international institution can be considered. However, they will be required to sit for an entrance test.

ASSESSMENT METHOD

Each subject will be assessed by examination (60%) and by a continuous assessment (20%) throughout the semester, by means of assignments, presentations or class tests which will be determined by the lecturer. Students will be given attendance marks (20%) including their participation.

REPEAT POLICY

- > Students who fail 3 or more subjects must repeat the whole semester.
- > Students who fail less than 3 subjects will be allowed for a retake examination by which the highest attainable grade is C. Students who fail in the retake paper must remodule the subject(s) in the next semester.
- ➤ No provision of supplementary class unless sufficient number of students register for a particular subject. Hence, students will have to wait for the next available class.

2. SARF

(ARABIC MORPHOLOGY)

SARF I & II (2 CREDIT HOURS EACH)

Very similar to Arabic grammar, the objective for Sarf is to complete the Tasrif (changes) of noun and verb so as to transition students to the diploma level.

Students will be able to understand the Tasrif from various aspects, such as in terms of time, number of letters and even changes from a noun to verb and vice versa and ultimately, applying it in written Arabic text.

In addition to the Tasrif, this subject will introduce students to the meanings and implications of Wazan (form) and how it can affect Arabic sentences.

3. INSHA'

(COMPOSITION & COMPREHENSION)



INSHA' I (2 CREDIT HOURS)

One of the main objectives of this subject is to equip students with a strong foundation in Arabic writing. In addition to writing, students will be able to exchange opinions and converse in the proper standard Arabic.

This level will strengthen their language skills. There are four key areas for this subject; oral examination, listening comprehension, comprehension, situational and narrative essay.

INSHA' II (2 CREDIT HOURS)

This is simply the next level to Insha' I, however topics will be more challenging. Plus, in essay writing, students will be exposed to expository writing.

Textbook: Students will use (العربية بين يديك) Volume 2.1 as the main syllabus book for Insha' I & II.

EXAMINATION FORMAT

There will be three parts: oral, comprehension text and composition.

A) Paper I (Oral exam) (30%)

- Conversation
- Picture discussion
- Readino

B) Paper II (Comprehension) (35%)

- Comprehension text
- Miscellaneous: Focuses on vocabulary and how to apply it, such as questions on synonyms and antonyms, singular and plural, explaining words, sentence constructions, and editing.

C) Paper III (Composition) (35%)

- This will be done outside of the examination period, during one of the 16 academic weeks.
 - Number of words for Insva` I will be no less than 120 words
 - Number of words for Insva` II will be no less than 150 words.

4. INTRODUCTION TO CLASSICAL ARABIC



INTRODUCTION TO CLASSICAL ARABIC I (BALAGHAH) (2 CREDIT HOURS)

Students will study the meanings and implications of Arabic structure and style used in any Arabic text. Introduction to Classical Arabic I will focus on analysing text and commenting on them and will not focus on the practical aspects.

INTRODUCTION TO CLASSICAL ARABIC II (ADAB) (2 CREDIT HOURS)

Students will be exposed to literary texts of Arabs such as Al-Quran, hadeeth among others. These texts are based on the medieval usage of Arab tribes. The sentence structure is the same as modern standard Arabic but the groupings, context and some of the words used are vastly different. There are some minor differences in grammar and punctuation of words between the Classical and modern standard versions of Arabic.



Plus, to instill in students that the motivation and intentions in learning the Arabic language is to understand the Qur'an and to foster a relationship to the Qur'an and ultimately Allah the Almighty.

There will be only one exam item which is the oral examination. It will amount to 100 marks and will be divided into two sections.

EXAMINATION FORMAT

Section 1 will focus on **memorisation**.

Section 2 will focus on **recitation** where students will be judged based on sound tajwid.

6. DIROSAT AL-ISLAMIYAH

(ISLAMIC SCIENCES)

In accordance with our objective of learning Arabic to attain greater understanding of *Islam* and its text, dirosaat al-islamiyyah will give a concise introduction to some of the fundamental of Islamic study through creed (Aqeedah) and Syariah (Fiqh). In addition, student will study the Islamic text by the way of exegesis (Tafsir) and prophetic tradition (Hadith).

DIROSAT AL-ISLAMIAH I (2 CREDIT HOURS)

Here the focus will be on the foundation of Islam, through Aqeedah and Fiqh.

DIROSAT AL-ISLAMIAH II (2 CREDIT HOURS)

The study of text in the form of Tafsir and Hadith will be the covered at this level.

The same four topics will be taught in the diploma level more extensively, thus at this level this subject will act as an introduction and preparation for the subsequent level.

Assessment will be based on class participation, student attendance, and academic activities. No written examination





DIPLOMA IN ARABICLANGUAGE

INTRODUCTION

In this programme, students will master the two major branches of the Arabic language; Arabic linguistics and literature. The Arabic linguistics will encompass multiple disciplines such as Nahu (syntax), Sarf (morphology), Fiqh Al-Lughah (comprehension of language) and Fan At-Tarjamah (art of translation). Students will study various theories surrounding Arabic linguistics such as the famous school of Basri and Kuufi. This is to give an in-depth understanding of Arabic linguistics through the perspective of Arabs and how it influences our understanding of the Qur'an and Hadith.

As for literature, students will not only learn the various literacy texts (Adab) but also analyse the style, the tone and the language of these texts through the study of Balaghah. Both will give insights into the culture and civilisation of Arabs which will ultimately allow students to comprehend as to why the Qur'an is the best form of Arabic literature. In addition, students will realise and appreciate that the words, sentence structure and style of language used in the Qur'an are detailed, accurate and purposeful.

These will grant students a better understanding of the language and a sense as to why this language was chosen as the last revelation in Islam and why learning this language is key in understanding the Qur'an and Hadith, which are fundamental in immersing with Islam. This course will provide a practical side to the language especially as students in Singapore's context. They will be equipped with Arabic communicational and writing skills. This will be useful for prospective students who will pursue their studies in any middle eastern or Malaysian universities. Lastly, students are also exposed to methods of Arabic teaching which is imperative as students will in turn be an educator in the future.

OBJECTIVE

- Very good proficiency in the four language skills.
- ➤ Very good concept and understanding of the Arabic language including all its branches and extensions.
- > Good understanding of Islamic sciences.

CERTIFICATION

Student must complete and pass all **80 credit hours** by which a diploma certificate in Arabic language will be granted.

LECTURE SCHEDULE

The curriculum is taught over 5 semesters of 80 weeks for 2.5 years, 16 credit hours for each semester.

ENTRY REQUIREMENT

- ➤ Direct entry for MIC pre-diploma holder with the passing grade of B or CGPA 3.00, Full-time pre-university madrasah graduate or equivalent qualification.
- ➤ GCE O-Level graduate, full-time secondary madrasah or equivalent (may be subjected to an entrance test.

ASSESSMENT METHOD

Each subject will be assessed by examination (60%) and by a continuous assessment (20%) throughout the semester, by means of assignments, presentations or class tests which will be determined by the lecturer. Students will be given attendance marks (20%) including their participation.

REPEAT POLICY

- > Students who fail 3 or more subjects must repeat the whole semester.
- > Students who fail less than 3 subjects will be allowed for a retake examination by which the highest attainable grade is C. Students who fail in the retake must remodule the subject(s) once available.

1. INSHA'

(COMPREHENSION, WRITING & COMMUNICATION)



INSHA' I - IV (2 CREDIT HOURS EACH)

This subject focuses on three key components; comprehension, essay writing and oral or communication, this format will be applied for all 5 semesters. For each component, students will be exposed to a specific language skill.

Firstly comprehension, students will be exposed on how to understand, analyse passages, and identify key and important points in passages. At a later stage in this subject, students are expected to comment on and discuss on points discussed in the passage. While trying to achieve the objectives, students must always practise and maintain good grammatical structures.

Secondly composition, where the focus is writing various forms such as essay, letter, and speech. Each semester, the theme of the topics will be more complex and challenging. As students advance through the subject simultaneously the topics will be in accordance with contemporary issues and local context. It goes without saying, students will be trained on how to construct grammatically sound and well-structured writing with cohesive ideas and arguments.

The last component of this subject will cover the conversational aspects of the language. This will equip students with the ability to converse and express ideas in Arabic confidently.

The textbook will be as follows:



4. BALAGHAH

(ARABIC RHETORIC)



AL-BALAGHAH I - IV (2 CREDIT HOURS EACH)

The study of Balaghah will be divided into four separate semesters.

Balaghah I & II ('Ilm Al-Ma'ani)

The subject will focus on the meanings and implications of the Arabic structure, style and tone used in any Arabic text. Students will be able to distinguish between words or phrases which are used in its normal usage (literal) from those which are used in a very specific context or for a specific purpose (rhetorical). Balaghah I will focus on the eight main chapters of Ma'ani.

These chapters will be discussed extensively and in depth with a particular focus on the Qur'an.

Balaghah III ('Ilm Al-Bayan)

The subject will focus on the multiple ways or styles of expressing a particular point or statement in the Arabic language. All the four chapters of Bayan will be covered.

Balaghah IV ('Ilm Al-Bayan & Ilm Al-Badii')

After we choose the finest of words and phrases through Ilm Al-Ma'ani and consider the best style with Ilm Al-Bayan, now comes the time to decorate and beautify our speech with Ilmu Badii'.

We can give an analogy to the three branches of Balaghah, like building a house. 'Ilm Al-Ma'ani is like drafting the blueprint and 'Ilm Al-Bayan is like choosing the correct material or substance of building a structure while 'Ilm Al-Badii' is like choosing the colour.

Studying Arabic literature can be a daunting task. This is largely due to the large geographical and chronological scope of Islam. Islam has been a major religion and cultural identity for the Arabs. The history of Islam is vast and great thus there are few ways to divide it. History of Islam in relation to Arabic literature can be divided to eight periods. Dividing these periods is imperative in understanding literacy text which is specific to a particular period and setting as there were dynasties and empires that controlled different lands and whose periods of rule stretched across these chronological divisions.

- 2. Early Islamic





12. TEACHING METHODOLOGY



TEACHING METHODOLOGY (2 CREDIT HOURS)

This intensive, interactive subject is developed for future teachers of Arabic. It addresses both the practical aspects of teaching Arabic as a foreign language and the underlying linguistic and cognitive processes.

It is an intensive, interactive subject devoted to the methodology of teaching Arabic to non-native speakers. It addresses both the practical aspects of teaching Arabic as a foreign language and the underlying linguistic and cognitive processes.

The subject will start with theories of second-language acquisition and a theoretical background on methods of teaching foreign languages, before moving to the practical aspects of teaching the four language skills (reading, writing, listening, and speaking). In addition, it will focus on a few important questions confronting the teacher of Arabic as a foreign language, such as teaching grammar, designing a syllabus, and writing lesson plans.
